Double Jeopardy — People and Process

As noted by <u>Big Law Business</u>, the legal industry is slow to change. Even as healthcare companies, financial institutions, and government agencies make the move to automated, integrated technologies, many law firms have doubled down on paper-based legacy processes to locate court documents, complete forms, and draft contracts.

But beyond legal borders, clients are rapidly adopting cloud-based technologies such as document e-signing, form auto-filling, and keyword-driven document discovery. As a result, lawyers now face the double jeopardy of people and processes. Clients aren't willing to pay more for services that can't keep pace with other industries, while existing processes can expose firms to potential compliance challenges and eDiscovery audits. Making matters worse? Without a unified document solution, lawyers are forced to use multiple applications across multiple platforms, both increasing the risk of error and reducing total productivity.

While manual processes may be familiar, they create a trio of troubles for lawyers:



STRUCTURE

60 percent of law firms say they <u>struggle with efficiency</u> due to lacking internal structures around document collection, storage, and collaboration.



SECURITY

Legacy processes make it <u>difficult to annotate, redact, and encrypt documents</u> <u>at scale</u>, increasing the risk of compliance challenges.



STANDARDIZATION

Clients and courts expect consistency across document types and access; fragmented data collection, contract creation, and content management can reduce client satisfaction.

Legal Eagles — Rise of the Machines

The evidence is clear. Document automation processes <u>improve</u> <u>outcomes</u>, including improved security, simplified collaboration, enhanced accuracy, and reduced waste. These improvements aren't incremental. As noted by <u>Inc.</u>, a recent study found that when 20 of the country's top lawyers took on an AI system designed to spot flaws in nondisclosure agreements (NDAs), there was a clear winner. While it took lawyers an average of 92 minutes to find NDA flaws with 85 percent accuracy, the AI alternative delivered 94 percent accuracy in just 26 seconds.

The good news for lawyers? This isn't a "replace" scenario. Instead, new technologies will help redefine current jobs. According to <u>Forbes</u>, while new technologies display strengths in error detection, contract template design and document creation that people can't match, the human ability to combine logic and emotion to create compelling arguments makes attorney skills invaluable.

With legal industry job opportunities growing at a consistent rate and predicted to remain consistent over the next decade as the market expands, there's an easy verdict here. Law firms need document management tools capable of aligning best practices with 21st-century expectations.

But a critical question remains: Is it better to buy and implement complete automation solutions, or build in white-labeled solutions that work inside existing apps?


LONG-TERM STORAGE AND SECURITY
